INTRODUCING CHARTING THE LIFECOURSE THINKING AND TOOLS

Join us on Wednesday, September 10, at 12pm for our new *LifeCourse in Action* series kick-off webinar, *Introducing Charting the LifeCourse Thinking and Tools*.

Charting the LifeCourse (CtLC) is a powerful yet simple set of person-centered tools that can improve both lives and systems. Across the country, people, families, and professionals are using LifeCourse thinking and tools to find support, solve problems, and share their vision for a good life.

During our kick-off presentation, Ingrid Flory, director of family support with DDS, will introduce CtLC framework and tools, share how CtLC is being used across Massachusetts, and facilitate an interactive activity walking participants through using one of the CtLC tools.

LifeCourse in Action webinars are presented in English on Zoom with live, simultaneous Spanish interpretation. Please let us know if you have any disability access or language access needs to attend this webinar.
